Academic Search Premier

Large databases (4000 journals) covering all areas of academia. 75% full text articles

Area Studies & Ethnic Studies (WWW links)

Good collection of Internet **links** leading to geographical, historical and cultural information about countries of the world.

Lexis-Nexis Academic Universe

Basic source of newspaper data. Covers national and **international newspapers**. Reference section includes **country profiles**.

Research Library

General index for academic periodicals. Some full text/ Covers some periodicals not covered by Academic Search Premier.

Social Science Information Gateway (SOSIG)

A comprehensive site of authoritative **links** for education, economics, politics, law, psychology, and all social sciences fields of interest.

Social Sciences (WWW links)

Web **links** to various aspects of culture and social relations

Sociological Collection

Subset of Academic Search Premier with journal citations and full text from Sociology journals

Wilson OmniFile: Full Text Select Edition

Smaller database of general college journals. Totally full text.

WorldCat (books and publications owned by libraries worldwide)

Very large database of approximately 85 million records. Includes any items catalogued in the world. Contains many duplicate records. Also shows many items of which there is only one copy in the world. International in scope. Multi-language.

Religious Databases www.tfc.edu/library

Christian Periodical Index

Citations only from approximately 100 evangelical Christian periodicals. Great for missions information .
No full text. Find journal article here at TFC or ILL

Religion and Philosophy Collection (In GALILEO)

Subset of Academic Search Premier. 75 % full text

ATLAS Full Text Plus

Full indexing for ATLA Religion journals (about 600) as well as full text for approximately 75 full text journals. Coverage back to 1975.

Religious Periodicals (in GALILEO)

Small collection of religious periodicals. Mostly full text

Tips for searching databases.....

**Know what kind of database you are in and what it will produce*

**Use a variety of search terms. Be flexible..*

**Make sure you are aware of other names and spellings for your people groups or location.*

**Get all the citation information when recording for a bibliography or ILL*

**Stick mostly to keyword searches. It broadens the areas being searched. Use author search if you have found a specific author who has written other things on your people group or region.*

**When using WorldCat watch for various entries for the same work. Also, note how many libraries hold your item. The more libraries that have your material the greater the chance we'll be able to borrow it.*
